Every four years, IFHE holds a World Congress to globally connect professionals and students.

The first Congress was held in 1908 in Fribourg Switzerland, hosting 750 delegates from 20 countries and had for its theme, 'The Training of Economics Teachers. Necessity of involving the greatest number of girls in Home Economics Education.' Congress has grown to host over 70 countries and well over a thousand delegates.

The theme of the 25th World Congress is Home Economics in a Time of Transformation: Bridging the Past - Charting the Future. Home Economics, as a field of study was founded in 1899, and, as we gather to celebrate the 25th World Congress in Ireland we have an exciting opportunity to advance ideas related to the conference theme. The social disruption and consequences of the pandemic are not yet well understood but it is accepted that this era has triggered new behaviours and ways of living. Home Economics can play a progressive role in shaping a more positive human experience and determining how we can address global issues that concern sustainable and healthy everyday living. What might 2024 and beyond mean for the human experience? Are transformative factors required to support individuals, families and consumers to mediate this transition?

We look forward to welcoming delegates from all over the world to the 25th World Congress. We invite professionals, researchers, practitioners and students to submit abstracts aligned with the Congress theme.

The week of the Congress is an opportunity for delegates to hear esteemed keynote speakers; engage in enriching concurrent sessions, poster sessions, workshops, symposia; view exhibits and the international sales market; as well as participate in social and cultural events such as the pre and post congress tours; opening cultural evening; opening ceremony; gala banquet and Céili; and the closing ceremony.

Congress Venue

The conference is hosted by the National Centre of Excellence for Home Economics, St Angela's College, Sligo, Ireland. The venue for the Congress is the University of Galway, University Rd, Galway, Ireland.

Galway, a harbour city on Ireland's west coast, sits where the river Corrib meets the Atlantic Ocean. The city's hub is 18th-century Eyre Square, a popular meeting spot surrounded by shops and traditional pubs that often offer live Irish folk music. Nearby, stone-clad cafes, boutiques and art galleries line the winding lanes of the Latin Quarter, which retains portions of the medieval city walls.

Galway is known as Ireland's Cultural Heart (Croí Cultúrtha na hÉireann) and hosts numerous festivals, celebrations and events. Many sporting, music, arts and other events take place in the city the summer of 2024 and may be of interest to you. The largest of these annual events begins with the:

Other Useful Information

Weather

Galway has a year-round mild, moist, temperate and changeable climate. The city does not experience temperature extremes and receives an average of 1,156 mm (45.51 in) of rain annually, which is evenly distributed throughout the year. The average January temperature in the city is 5.9 °C (43 °F) and the average July temperature is 15.9 °C (61 °F).

While extreme weather is rare, the city and county can experience

severe windstorms. Most of these storms occur between late autumn and early spring. Due to the city's northerly location, Galway has long summer days. Sunrise on summer solstice occurs at 05:07 and sunset at 22:07. By contrast, on winter solstice, the sun rises at 08:49 and sets at 16:19.

Time Zone in June

The island of Ireland, including both the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland, is on the GMT/UTC time zone. Like most countries in Europe, Ireland observes Daylight Saving Time (DST), with the clock shifting forward one hour at the end of March and one hour backward at the end of October.

Currency: Euro €

- Coin There are eight different coin denominations: €2, €1, 50c, 20c, 10c, 5c, 2c and 1c
- Paper There are seven different denominations of euro banknotes: €5, €10, €20, €50, €100, €200 and €500

Visa and Letter of Invitation

World Congress attendees who need a visa to enter Ireland should apply for a visa at the nearest Irish Embassy or Consulate in the country where they live. Please apply for a visa well in advance of travel.
